#### Gaeilge

We have registered our school for the Gaelbhratach. Our work starts now! The Gaelbhratach scheme was established in response to the need to create natural opportunities to speak Irish outside of the formal classroom setting. The scheme officially began in the 2012/13 school year at primary



level and at secondary level the following year. In the years since, the scheme has worked with every kind of school in all corners of the country – from both urban and rural schools seeking to breathe new life into Gaeilge, to Irish-medium and Gaeltacht schools where it is spoken as the main language every day. The work will be led by Ms. Burke and a committee of students elected.

As part of this work, we have all started to learn and use a Nath na Seachtaine (Phrase of the Week) and a Briathar na Seachtaine (Verb of the Week). This week we are currently learning:

Nath - Fáilte Romhat (You are welcome)

Briathar - Dún (To close)

After completing recount writing, all classes are moving on to narrative writing. This genre of writing focuses on storytelling elements like character development, plot, and setting.

#### SSE

The staff of St. Michael's are continuing their SSE cycle 2022—2026. School self evaluation is a collective, inclusive and reflective process of internal school review. The process involves gathering information from a range of sources about the quality of teaching and learning in our school and then making decisions.

Under departmental guidance and that of OIDE, we will continue to target physical wellbeing.

The three targets in our School Improvement Plan for this year are:

- To implement the new wholeschool PE plan, incorporating the Move Well, Move Often programme
- To develop the pupils' physical literacy and in turn help to improve their physical wellbeing
- To enhance participation of all pupils in PE lessons

In September we covered the strand **Outdoor** and **Adventure** and the fundamental movement skill **Walking**. This month we are covering the strand **Athletics** and the fundamental movement skill **Running**.

#### **Child Safeguarding**

As part of our annual review of our Child Safeguarding Statement and Risk Assessment we delivered a child safety survey to our pupils asking them if they feel safe in school and to state why or why not. The results show that 91% of our pupils feel safe and 9% of our pupils don't feel safe.

We endeavour to ensure that all our pupils feel safe in St. Michael's and we continue to work to achieve this.
